Dear DAA Families,

For several days this week, members of DAA's leadership team and I had the opportunity to attend the Global Education and Skills Forum (GESF), which was held here in Dubai. GESF is an effort to bring together leaders from the public, private, and social sectors to address education's greatest challenges. The Varkey Foundation, GEMS Education, Dubai Cares, Mashreq Bank, Microsoft, Parthenon, All Prints, and Western Union all play major roles in sponsoring the event. Keynote speakers at GESF included former US President Bill Clinton, former UK Prime Minister Tony Blair, and a host of other influential leaders and thinkers from around the world. DAA received the honor of hosting two former heads of state - former President Luis Alberto Lacalle of



Uruguay (left, bottom) and former Prime Minister Hamadi Jebali of Tunisia (left, top). Many DAA students from all divisions were involved in Mr. Lacalle and Mr. Jebali's visit, including all of our students from those two countries! Our student-leaders greeted them, our MS band played the UAE national anthem, our PS students sang a fabulous welcome song, our MS students talked about their WWW adventures, our HS IB Art students talked about their fabulous work while IB

the atmosphere, and groups of students engaged with the two former leaders in question-and-answer sessions about internationalmindedness, democracy, leadership, education, and a few other meaningful topics. The climax of GESF was probably the announcement of the Global Teaching Prize, which is a one million dollar award from the Varkey Foundation that will be given annually from this point forward to one inspirational and innovative teacher. The first recipient of this award was Nancie Atwell, who is from Maine, USA. Mrs. Atwell has been teaching and writing since the early 1970s and has had an enormous impact on reading-writing workshop pedagogy. She definitely had a major impact on my career when I started teaching in the late 1980s. Her book In the Middle was a must-read for any teacher trying to improve their practice and Mrs. Atwell continues to teach to this day.

I will close my message in this edition of SPOTS with a challenge that Mr. Sunny Varkey, the founder of GEMS, issued at the end of GESF. Mr. Varkey would like teachers, students, and parents to tweet about the teacher who was their greatest inspiration. Mr. Varkey wants brilliant teachers to be recognized and for the profession to receive the respect it deserves.

We move into the final stretch of the year after a well-deserved spring holiday. Thank you for your continued support!
