Dear DAA Families,

In our last SPOTS before the winter holidays, I am struck by how quickly this year is passing by. The weeks between the Eid break in October and the beginning of the winter break next year have flown by, and we all look forward to resuming a more regular schedule in the months ahead.

I would like thank the many parents who attended conferences, concerts, and other special events in the last few weeks, as well as to those dedicated DAAPA volunteers who have transformed our PS/ES atrium into a winter wonderland. DAA needs to be a safe, child-centered place where teachers are idealistic about the potential of every student and tenacious in their support for a child as she learns, takes risks, makes mistakes, and grows. As we all know, human beings tend to normalize their behavior. My hope is that DAA continues to understand this and that we consistently work to build an ethos in which the pursuit of excellence and intolerance for mediocrity is normal—for students, parents, and teachers. That ethos takes effort, commitment, and passion, and absolutely requires a positive, healthy home-school partnership.

Our efforts to improve security at DAA are continuing, and I anticipate that you will soon begin to see more changes around the campus. I am pleased to share that Saeed Al Muntafiq, GEMS' CEO, visited DAA last week, and he enthusiastically supports our efforts to improve the school's security systems. He agrees that this obligation is sacred and is every school's most essential duty. It is, after all, only after students feel safe and secure, physically and emotionally, that learning can occur.

The next full SPOTS will be released in January. Until then, we wish you happy holidays, and safe and joyful travels, both near and far.






