### FROM THE SUPERINTENDENTS' OFFICE

Dear DAA Families,

As I commented in a recent edition of SPOTS, the final two months between our spring and summer holidays begin a season of graduations and transitions, of testing and exams, and of competitions, celebrations, and performances across all four divisions of the school. I would like to wish the best to our seniors, who will begin their IB exams in the next few days. They've worked hard over the past two years—and long before that, in fact—and are positioned well for success. I wish them much success!

Even as our seniors prepare to leave DAA behind, they continue to contribute to their school through their commitments to athletics and other activities. Last weekend, DAA participated in Season 3 MESAC tournaments and meets. The effort and determination of our athletes always impresses me. Many thanks to our coaches, who give so much to their athletes and teams. Special thanks and congratulations is due to Emily Rentsch, who has done a fabulous job in her first year as DAA's athletic director. I am very grateful for all that Emily has accomplished this year. We have our end-of-year sports banquets coming up in a few weeks, and I hope to see many of you there.

And congratulations to the cast, crew, and directors of *The Little Mermaid Jr.* What a fantastic production! We have a terrific fine arts team across the four divisions at DAA and a remarkable number of dedicated teachers who contribute to the success of student productions. I would like to thank all of the dedicated volunteers. It is a joy seeing what DAA's talented students and teachers are able to produce. *The Little Mermaid Jr.* is the latest example of how that hard work pays off!

As discussed in the most recent edition of SPOTS, Ramadan will begin on June 5, which means we need to modify many of our normal routines around DAA for the final weeks of the school year, including the starting and ending times for school. Please refer to the April 14 edition of SPOTS to review those details.

We also recently shared our 2016-17 School Calendar, which finally received KHDA approval. Please know that most of the dates in our calendar are pre-determined by KHDA – for example, winter and spring holidays – and that schools have very little autonomy over their own calendars as the result of the "school days" and "instructional days" we are obliged to meet. The only way we can create a school holiday, such as a mid-term break in February, is by extending the school year – either earlier in August or later in June. This was especially complicated for 2017 because we know Eid will happen in June, which means there will me holidays the week after we are scheduled to end school on June 22. Below follow significant dates we want all families to be aware of:

August 25 - New Student Orientation

August 28 - First day of school for students in Grades 1 through 12

August 29 - First day of school for students in KG1 and KG2

December 16-January 1 – Winter Holiday (Classes resume on January 2)

March 24-April 8 - Spring Holiday (Classes resume on April 9)

June 22 - Last day of school for all students

Dates for local and national holidays are included in DAA's 2016-17 Calendar, which we have attached again for your convenience.

I do want to point out something different in our calendar next year that will have a slight impact on families. We have scheduled four full Professional Learning Days on September 20, October 11, February 7, and March 5. (That's three Tuesdays and one Sunday.) Teachers will be required to be in attendance on these days, but not students. Most parents are likely not aware of our behind-the-scenes work to make sure our teachers' professional knowledge is current and that they are exposed to best practice research. Most of this work is carried out now on Tuesdays, but we have struggled to carve out enough time for professional learning. Exceptional international schools reserve the time to coordinate a professional development plan that brings out the best in creative, smart, dedicated teachers. Our goal for 2016-17 is to launch a synchronized learning plan to support teachers' growth, but we need to commit the time to make this plan successful, which is the reason why we have scheduled these four full professional learning days.



MAP Testing is Underway! We began MAP testing on Monday and will continue next week. As a reminder, we give students MAP tests to determine individual instructional levels and to measure academic growth throughout the school year, and from year to year in the areas of reading, language arts and mathematics. The tests are completely computerized and are unique in that they adapt to be appropriate for each child's level of learning. As a result, each student has the same opportunity to succeed and maintain a positive attitude toward testing.

Please check your child's class blog for the testing schedule, and remember the following tips for preparing your child for testing:

Tips to help your child to be ready for a good test experience:

- Make sure that your child is well rested on school days. Children who are tired in class are less able to pay attention or focus on the demands of a test.
- Give your child a well-rounded diet. A healthy body leads to a healthy and active mind.
- Encourage your child to listen to directions and give every question their best effort.
