### FROM THE SUPERINTENDENTS' OFFICE

Dear DAA Families,

As you know, earlier this week I wrote to inform you of DAA's 2015-16 DSIB inspection result and the associated fee increase for 2016-17. I would have communicated this information to you earlier this spring, but KHDA prohibits schools from sharing their inspection results until reports for all schools are made public. Thus, I was unable to inform you about our fee increase as that could not be made public until DAA's inspection result was official.

I do appreciate that another fee increase is hard news for many families. With the quality of life we enjoy in Dubai comes the high cost of living we experience here. The cost of a private education for the children of expat families is a major factor in that cost of living, to be sure, especially when families are self-paying or when employers cover only partial tuition concessions. I assure you that I am keenly aware of these considerations, and it pains me every time we lose a student because our tuition has risen too high.

However, I also want to reiterate the commitment of GEMS Education to reinvest in DAA's facilities and programming. I reported in my letter that GEMS has committed to renovating and improving DAA's facilities and campus over time. Those works will begin this summer. GEMS has also committed to supporting our strategic efforts to improve our educational programming. This investment in DAA, I believe, will allow us to continue our efforts to make this an elite school.

While some of you may have already taken the annual parent satisfaction survey released by GEMS, I would like to take this opportunity to encourage all parents to share their feedback. The survey asks that you rate the 11 statements below on a 10-point scale:

- 1. I am happy with my child's progress at school.
- 2. I am satisfied that the quality of teaching supports my child's individual learning needs.
- 3. The school offers strategies and opportunities for families to support learning at home.
- 4. I am happy with the way the school supports my child's personal and social development.
- 5. The school provides guidance so my child knows what to do to do to improve in school.
- 6. The Leader of Head of the school has a positive impact on the school.
- 7. There is effective communication between the school and home.
- 8. The school makes my child want to learn.
- 9. I feel it is important for my child to learn Arabic at school.
- 10. I would recommend this school to others.
- 11. Overall, I am satisfied with the school.

Feedback from this survey is collected by the Senior Manager – Parental Relations at GEMS, which makes this a great opportunity for parents to share their concerns directly with GEMS. Results from the survey will be shared with DAA in June. In particular, the final open-text question on the survey, which follows below, offers parents an opportunity to share concerns. I would be very grateful if each family could take time to respond to the survey, as your feedback can only help DAA become a better school.

### Important Announcement about UAE equivalency

The number of universities in the UAE is constantly growing and expanding educational opportunities for those who wish to stay in the country. While some government institutions are open to UAE nationals only, many foreign universities have opened campuses in the UAE. From many of these universities you can receive a diploma upon graduation that is just as valuable as if you had attended the university on its home campus.

The Application Process Universities in the UAE generally require National Secondary School equivalency granted by the Ministry of Education in addition to your high school diploma. This includes the following requirements:

- take and pass classes and exams for Arabic or Arabic as a Foreign Language (Arabic B) every year you attend high school in a GCC country
- 2. for Muslim students, take and pass classes and the exams for Islamic or Special Islamic every year you attend high school in a GCC country
- 3. achieve at least a 400 on the Math section of the SAT Reasoning Test
- 4. achieve at least a 500 on the international paper-based TOEFL

Many universities only look at the grades from your last 3 years in high school.

Keep in mind that although a school may post a June or July application deadline, many of these are on a rolling basis and seats may fill up long before the official deadline.
