FROM THE SUPERINTENDENTS OFFICE

Dear DAA Families,

I would like to begin my message this week with very sincere congratulations to the many deserving students and teachers around DAA who have recently concluded major competitions, both athletic and academic. When I wrote two weeks ago, the results of season-ending competitions in volleyball, swimming, and academic games were unknown. Results are now in and I'm pleased to congratulate DAA's varsity, junior varsity, and U-14 students, who performed well in local and MESAC conference tournaments and meets. MESAC champions included Jibola Ajayi's Varsity Olympiad Team in Academic Games and Ryan Erickson's JV girls volleyball team. DAA's Athletic Director, Emily Rentsch, provides a detailed description of DAA's results later in this edition of SPOTS, and I encourage you to spend a few minutes enjoying the photos and reading about our students' performances. I'd also like to thank the coaches who worked with our students over the first two months of the school year. The financial compensation for taking on coaching responsibilities is not great, particularly given the hours a coach or sponsor invests in his or her team. They do it for the love of the game and because they hold deep convictions about the value of sport and competition for young people. Thank you.

As we begin Season 2, I'd like to remind parents why it's so important to encourage your children to participate in sports and/or other activities at DAA. A growing body of research about participation in sports, for example, contends that participation results in higher academic achievement, higher self-esteem, and fewer behavioral problems. Many studies focus on the effects of sports on the five Cs – competence, confidence, connections, character, and caring – and on the lifelong benefits of playing sports – the discipline of training, the importance of teamwork, how to lead and follow, and how to lose with grace and class. Sports played a critical role in my own youth once upon a time, and I wouldn't trade those lessons learned for anything.

Thank you to all parents who took the time to complete the two surveys we released recently – the first concerned PH7, DAA's new catering company, and the second concerned Threads, GEMS's new uniform supplier. The results from these surveys have already been shared with PH7 and Threads, as well as with GEMS, and I will meet with representatives from both companies in the next two weeks.

Also, thank you to all parents who attended PS and ES parent-teachers conferences or who will attend MS and HS conferences later this week. The relationships you form with your children's teachers are important, so I would like to offer you the following advice to all MS and HS parents prior to this week's conferences:

- Talk to your son or daughter beforehand about how things are going in each class.
- Take time to understand how grade level standards and expectations work.
- Make a list of questions or talking points before the conference.
- Don't be afraid to ask for clarity.
- Ask what you can do, specifically, to help your child.
- Share personal insight about your child that will help the teacher work with him/her more effectively.
- Make sure you know how to check on your child's progress.
- Find out the best way to communicate with the teacher.
- Develop a positive working relationship with your child's teacher.
- Leave the conference on a good note!



Finally, it's only fitting with Thanksgiving approaching that I thank my faculty and my leadership team for their remarkable effort, dedication, and commitment in the current school year to-date. The demands on teachers at high-performing schools like DAA are intense and our pace can be exhausting. The weeks between the Eid holiday in September and the winter holiday in December are especially intense - perhaps 'unrelenting' is a better choice of words. I think it's worth asking why DAA's teachers are willing to give so much. I assure you it's not they're overpaid or because they can't find work elsewhere. DAA's teachers are willing to give so much because they love working their students - that is, your children. That matters a great deal, I think, to the ethos and culture of a school. The quality of the relationships between teachers and students is noticeable in so many ways. I have a son who graduated from DAA two years ago and a daughter who is currently in Grade 11. My son is about to enter his third year of university in January (thanks to IB credit) and continues to tell me how well he was prepared at DAA for his tertiary studies. I have never ceased to be amazed by the dedication not only of my children's teachers, but also from the principals, assistant principals, coordinators, secretaries, aides, and others who have supported them. My wife and I consider ourselves very fortunate to work at DAA, but also to have our children attend school here.

Discussion on technology between students and admin ITGS, or IT in a Global Society, is an IB class in which students explore the profound relationship between individuals and the technologies we use whether seen or unseen.

One of the topics we were exploring was the idea of using technology to monitor employees. Students researched current events that involved employee monitoring to some extent, interviewed teachers, and then interviewed our HS Principal, Mr. Scott Schaffner and the Assistant Principal, Mr. Paul McMahon.

Scott and Paul engaged in a lengthy and candid Q&A session with the kids leaving them with a real world and authentic understanding of how administrators in our school view this technology. They also walked away from it learning more about their own administrators and a feel for hierarchical relationships. An enduring understanding that the students could take with them was the importance of trust in the workplace and how privacy is treated by people in different sectors.

Five minutes after finishing the session, Mr. Jim Hardin, our superintendent, also joined the conversation. Although it was completely unscripted, Jim echoed both Paul and Scott's sentiments regarding trust and privacy. Students were able to contrast these opinions with those of executives in other fields giving them a real world basis to ground the rest of their learning on.
